Letter from the Board of Trustees:

Little Red Schoolhouse has had another wonderful school year! We are a unique learning building. Our teachers plan enriching lessons for our K-2 students, parents attend special school gatherings, and guest readers visit often, to name a few. We, the Board of Education, have observed and heard how the students at Little Red have made many milestones learning and exploring new topics of interest. Our school campus provides the needed office and administration staff support on a daily basis. We embrace the changes that continue to occur in our school and community and we provide support and sound decision-making throughout the course of the year.

During the 2023-2024 school year, we saw an increased need for special education services provided to our students and our budget supports these changes. Approximately 53% of the North Greenbush annual budget goes to tuition and transportation costs of indistrict students that attend our partnering school districts. Our 2023 summer program was successful in keeping students active in their learning, and we continue to look for ways to provide more opportunities for our students by seeking grants.

One area that continues to expand and blossom is "The Little In 'Between Library" that adjoins the breezeway between the original building and the new addition. The children enjoy the books donated by everyone in our community, so please continue to support our young readers at Little Red! In addition to that, our STEM program is thriving, and the students enjoy the opportunities to learn more about Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics on a weekly basis. Our music program also provides students with weekly lessons to learn about instruments, rhymes, rhythm, songs, and performances.

As our community expands with new developments, we have seen our numbers at Little Red rise along with our tuition-based students. We are responsible for the operation and management of the school district and provide education for all children in our district. In addition, we maintain payments on bonds for the Capital Project for our school addition and are consistently monitoring newly developed home assessments on our tax roll. Last year, we saw a loss in assessment value with a change in one of our PILOT (Payment In Lieu of Taxes) properties in the district; and although we continue to see increasing costs in expenditures, as we prepare for this upcoming years' budget, we will use the district fund balance wisely and closely monitor all expenditures.

Your Board of Trustees appreciates all of the community's support and feedback. We look forward to a new school year with continued growth and success of our children.

From the Superintendent:

The administrative team, along with the Board of Education, have worked diligently to establish a 2024-2025 school budget that meets the needs of our students and our taxpayers. The Little Red Schoolhouse continues to grow and provide a unique learning experience for our students.

The 2023-2024 school year welcomed 31 kindergarten – grade 2 students to our very special place to learn and develop. With the 2023-2024 school year, we continue to expand our instructional programs, as well as our support program for our K-2 students. We successfully implemented our STEM program. As part of their daily learning center block, the students are engaged in a multitude of challenging learning activities in the content area of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. It is so rewarding to hear the excitement in the students' voices as they share their STEM creations with the office staff and the teachers! Additionally, we have been afforded the opportunity to continue to provide our music program and our physical education program to all students as part of their daily curriculum. In the 2023-2024 school year we increased our student support programs to offer speech and language services, occupational services, RTI (response to intervention) and special education services to those students who require additional support in these areas. We were also able to fund a school counselor to support our social, emotional learning curriculum.

Once again, this summer, we are fortunate to provide our six-week Enrichment Summer School Program to our K-2 students with the support from the Federal Grant Funds. We appreciate the support from our families who stay connected with our dedicated classroom teachers in providing support and encouragement to our students daily. As we enter the 2024-2025 school year, the district will continue to focus on providing a safe and enriching learning environment for kindergarten, grade 1 and grade 2 students every day. On behalf of the North Greenbush Common School District, we extend our sincerest gratitude to our families and community for their continuous support.

The school budget increase is 1.265%. The tax levy limit (tax cap) is 5.747%

A school district's tax levy can be separated into two major components. First are taxes collected to support the general, daily operations of a school, such as salary and benefits, maintenance, and utilities, as well as transportation. Second are taxes collected to support

capital expenditures, such as serial bonds issued for the new school addition.

Only taxes for the first component factor into the calculation of the tax levy limit. The second component, capital expenditures, are excluded from the tax levy limit calculation because serial bonds are obligations which must be paid regardless of other revenue and expenditure considerations. For 24-25, approximately 7.78% of the proposed school budget is for debt service.

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2024-25 by the qualified voters of the North Greenbush Common School District, Rensselaer County, New York, will be held at the Little Red School House on Tuesday, May 21, 2024 between the hours of 2:30 pm and 8:30 pm, prevailing time in the Little Red School House, at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot or machine. _____

1. The basic school tax relief (STAR) exemption is authorized by section 425 of the Real Property Tax Law.

Qualifications for voters:

- Must be a citizen of the United States
- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Must be a resident of the North Greenbush Common School District for at least 30 days prior to May 16, 2022

ABSENTEE BALLOTS:

Qualified district resident voters who are unable to go to the polls on May 21, 2024, are able to cast their vote by absentee ballot. <u>Applications</u> for absentee ballots can be requested at the District Office: 49 North Greenbush Rd., Troy, New York. The last day that the District Office can mail an absentee ballot to voters who have submitted a completed absentee ballot application, is May 15, 2024. **Absentee Ballots must be received by 3:00pm May 21, 2024.**

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: How is the tax levy calculated?

A: The tax levy is the amount of dollars needed in order to balance the school district budget. By state law the tax levy increase is limited to an amount called a tax cap.

Q: How is the NYS Tax Cap Calculated?

A: The school tax cap is a formulated calculation based on a number of factors such as prior year's levy, allowable levy growth factor of 2% or rate of inflation (whichever is lower), tax base growth factor, pilots and if any specific exclusions such as bonded debt service. Please refer to chart below to see the history of tax cap calculations are that we have been including in these newsletters.

Q: What is the difference between the tax levy and the tax rate?

A: The tax levy is the amount of dollars needed in order to balance the budget. The tax rate is used to determine how much any specific piece of property (residential, commercial or industrial) contributes to the overall tax levy. It is calculated by using the amount of the taxes that need to be levied divided by the total amount of the taxable assessed residential and commercial property in the school district.

Senior Citizen Tax Exemption

Partial tax exemption is offered to persons who are 65 years of age or older with limited incomes. The property owners must file an application annually, on forms prescribed by the State Board, in the assessor's office by March 1st before the day for filing the final assessment role or such other times as may be hereinafter fixed by law.
